Founding



THE DAUGHTERS OF CHARITY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL The Daughters of Charity were founded in 1633 in Paris, France. They are a Society of Apostolic Life, given to God, in Community for the service of the poor.

Inspired by the Gospel vision of St. Vincent de Paul, St. Louise de Marillac and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the Daughters of Charity are given to God in Community, for the service of persons living in poverty.

There are 17,000 Daughters of Charity serving in the world located in 94 countries and on every continent except Antarctica. They have ministered in Evansville for 154 years.

First Facility 1872

At the request of Bernard Schapker, an Evansville businessman, corresponds with Sister Euphemia requesting the Daughters of Charity Maryland come to Evansville and a hospital. On July 18, 1872, first patient, a man who fell ill traveling upriver before stopping in Evansville was admitted to St Mary's. The Sisters happily prepare a bed for the grateful stranger in one of the renovated rooms, and send for a doctor. The next day, Sister Marie Voelker, DC, and three other Daughters of Charity officially open St. Mary's Hospital, the first hospital in Evansville, in the old Marine hospital on the banks of the Ohio River. It operated until 1894 when the facility up sized and moved to First Avenue.




The city's rapid growth in population and industry required a larger hospital. Under the leadership of hospital administrator Sister Mary Agnes Farrell, the Sisters purchased seven lots on the corner of First Avenue and Columbia to build a new hospital. A new St. Mary's Hospital opened at the corner of First Avenue and Columbia Street in 1894. this new hospital offered many modern innovations, including steam-powered elevators and operating room lighting so bright that doctors can operate as well at night.

Third Campus 1956

In one day, on March 10, 1956, St. Mary's closed its First Avenue hospital and opened the current Washington Avenue hospital, in a massive move known as "Operation Good Neighbor." The entire staff of the hospital and nearly 800 volunteers moved 97 patients and all of the hospital's equipment using 215 tractors, trailers and vans donated by local businesses. Estimates at the time suggested the operation saved the hospital over \$100,000 in moving costs.

In 2012, St. Mary's Health (which included the hospital) was integrated into St. Vincent Health, a larger statewide healthcare ministry. The hospital officially became Ascension St. Vincent Evansville in 2017.

Ascension St. Vincent Evansville is now the flagship hospital of the Ascension St. Vincent network in the Illinois-Indiana-Kentucky tri-state area and a level II trauma center, serving Vanderburgh County and the surrounding region.

Center For Advanced Medicine 2006

In 2006 the Center for Advanced Medicine made possible consolidation of services in previously decentralized parts of the campus. It increased patient convenience, and separated outpatient services to provide improved processes and efficiency.

Orthopedic Hospital 2017





Ascension St. Vincent Orthopedic Hospital in Evansville, Indiana, broke ground in 2017. The \$95 million, 135,000-square-foot facility opened its doors in 2019
