



Residency purpose

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

The pharmacy residency program at Ascension St. Joseph aims to develop pharmacists who are competent, confident and compassionate practitioners. They will function as effective members of the healthcare team with the ultimate goal of providing optimal pharmaceutical care to patients. These pharmacists will possess the knowledge and experience required to be proficient in appropriate medication use. They will develop and practice effective written and verbal communication skills, and become valuable educators of healthcare professionals, patients, students and the community. Residency graduates will demonstrate time management and independent thinking skills that will make them leaders within their practice settings and within the profession.

The St. Joseph PGY1 pharmacy program has ambulatory care and acute care tracks. The program is individualized to meet the needs of each resident through research project selection, elective rotation offerings and personalized scheduling. The resident will participate in both site-specific and system-level committees, and assist with evaluating and improving patterns of drug utilization. Residents may also obtain a teaching certificate through Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy. A yearlong research project will be presented at the ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting and the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin Pharmacy Residency Conference.

Ascension Columbia St. Mary's Hospital Milwaukee is a community teaching hospital located in Milwaukee, just north of downtown. The Lake Drive Campus is made up of two hospitals: the Main Hospital and Women's Medical Center, and two large clinics: Prospect Medical Commons and Water Tower Medical Commons. Average daily inpatient census is approximately 225 patients.

Ascension Columbia St. Mary's offers advanced cardiovascular and neurological surgery services; a regional burn center; women's health services; a neonatal intensive care unit; 48 adult intensive care unit beds; 160 medical/surgical beds; and a 45-bed emergency department. Additionally, an outpatient chemotherapy infusion center and anticoagulation clinic are part of the campus. Ascension Columbia St. Mary's serves as the tertiary care referral center for seven Southeastern Wisconsin Ascension hospitals. As a result, the area's most complex medical and surgical cases come to Ascension Columbia St. Mary's for care.

They will improve medication safety and appropriate medication use as effective members of healthcare teams. Through the development of written and oral communication skills, residents completing this program will become effective educators of healthcare professionals, patients and students. Residents completing the program will learn to integrate therapeutic knowledge with an understanding of the healthcare system, and to become proficient in improving patient care through the development of drug therapy-related policies and procedures. Residency graduates will demonstrate critical thinking and time management skills that will allow them to become self-directed leaders within both their practice setting and the pharmacy profession.





Ascension Wisconsin - Milwaukee

The Ascension Wisconsin Ambulatory Care Pharmacy Service provides chronic disease management, anticoagulation, population health and specialty services for Ascension Wisconsin Medical Group clinicians and their patients. Through longitudinal rotations, the resident will gain a broad range of experiences within an academic health system. This dynamic and expanding area of practice provides clinical services to a diverse group of ambulatory patients. The PGY2 Ambulatory Care pharmacy residency program at Ascension Wisconsin is designed to provide PGY1 graduates the opportunity to grow beyond generalist practice and further the development of specialized care in areas specific to ambulatory patients. It is assumed that the resident has already achieved a basic level of competence commensurate with that of a PGY1 Pharmacy Residency. The PGY2 residency focuses on developing knowledge, attitudes, training and skills necessary to cultivate pharmacists who are competent and compassionate practitioners who are prepared for a role as an ambulatory care pharmacist.

Daily activities will include seeing patients; providing phone-based or web-based care to patients; reviewing clinic policies for appropriateness; and implementing quality assurance programs for current and new clinics. The ambulatory care resident will be expected to be proficient at working in the clinics they are working with and, from time to time, will be expected to work as a pharmacist in that setting to understand firsthand the best way to implement policies/procedures that affect staff and to provide professional growth.


